Thank you for previously registering your interest in the JB Hi-Fi Class Action.

We are writing to provide you with a notice from the Supreme Court of Victoria. You can access the notice [here](#).

Why Maurice Blackburn is sending you this Notice

As you may recall from when you registered, if you purchased an extended warranty from JB Hi-Fi at any time between 1 January 2011 and 8 December 2023, you are a "group member" in the JB Hi-Fi Class Action.

Class actions in Australia work on an "opt out" basis. This means that unless a group member actively chooses to leave the class action by "opting out", then they are automatically included and covered by it.

Before the trial of the class action begins, the law requires that group members must be given an "opt out notice" from the Court. This notice provides information about the class action and gives group members an opportunity to opt out if they do not wish to participate.

Maurice Blackburn is sending this notice by email to everyone who has previously registered their interest in the JB Hi-Fi Class Action. Between 2 March and 1 May 2026, a notice is also being sent by email or SMS to people identified in JB Hi-Fi's records as having purchased an extended warranty between 2011 and 2023. Accordingly, you may receive two notices about the opt out deadline.

What you need to do

Please read the [opt out notice](#) carefully.

You do not need to do anything right now if you want to stay in the JB Hi-Fi Class Action.

You will **never** be asked to pay anything out of your own pocket by participating in the class action.

If you do **not** want to stay in the class action, you must fill out the form on the Supreme Court of Victoria's website [here](#).

The deadline to opt out is **29 May 2026 at 4:00PM (AEST)**.
